A request for access to your land in 2016

Dear Sir/Madam,

The bearer of this letter is a volunteer taking part in a national wildlife survey called the "*National Amphibian and Reptile Recording Scheme (NARRS)*". It began in 2007 and takes place at hundreds of locations across the UK each year.

NARRS is coordinated by Amphibian and Reptile Conservation. We are a national wildlife charity dedicated to the conservation of amphibians and reptiles. Many people are concerned that amphibians and reptiles are declining across the UK and the aim of NARRS is to help us find out whether this is the case.

NARRS volunteers are allocated a random one-kilometre grid square within which they carry out several survey visits to search for amphibians and reptiles. This involves visiting suitable habitat on foot and using simple techniques to look for amphibians and reptiles.

We would be very grateful if you would grant permission for our volunteer to carry out their survey on your land. The survey will not damage property or be detrimental to you in any way, and the results will be used to benefit nature conservation.
